Most of local governments in developing Asian countries, including Indonesia have not enough environmentally sound waste management facilities. A huge amount of municipal solid waste is not collected properly nor usually dumped in rivers or open spaces, open burned. Even if waste is collected, most of wastes are sent to open dumping sites. These practices have caused environmental, health, and social problems. To tackle such problems, many countries in Asia have put efforts to invest in sanitary landfill and waste treatment facility for these two decades.

One of challenges of waste management is how to organize the regional cooperation to collect, treat and dispose waste. Economy of scale exists in waste treatment facility and landfill site. Unit cost of construction of waste-to-energy facility and sanitary landfill is lowering, as capacity of facility increases. The institutional arrangement of regional cooperation among local governments also affect the investment of private sector under the scheme of Public and Private Partnership.

The objective of this seminar is to share experiences in institutional arrangement of regional waste management in Asian region, and to identify the challenge to organize regional cooperation and policy measures to facilitate regional cooperation on waste management in Indonesia.
