### Brainstorming the visions of the Global Energy Market Transition: From Vision to Action

The Thailand Ministry of Energy and the United Arab Emirates co-host the 7<sup>th</sup> Asian Ministerial Energy Roundtable (AMER7), 1-3 November at Shangri-La Hotel, Bangkok. This prestigious Ministerial Energy Roundtable is a platform for energy ministers from Asian countries and leading international energy organisations to bilaterally meet and discuss important issues on three main aspects – oil markets, gas markets and disruptive technologies – and their impacts on the Asian region. Key discussions include current energy situations, the future of energy supply and demand, global energy security challenges – especially with oil and natural gas – and sustainable energy development.

During the Ministerial Roundtable, a variety of inspiring visions and implications under the concept “Global Energy Market Transition: From Vision to Action” are presented in hopes that they can advance Asia’s future energy security and efficiency while creating a more sustainable energy system.



Air Chief Marshal Prajin Juntong, Deputy Prime Minister, delivered the opening speech at the 7<sup>th</sup> Asian Ministerial Energy Roundtable (AMER7) in which he revealed his vision and presented practical guidelines for responding to the oil and natural gas markets, and for taking steps towards alternative energy implementation during this age of disruptive technologies.
