Yangon—27 Sept 2013: Myanmar's journalists today attended the one-day workshop specifically designed to improve their ability to cover and articulate issues related to the ASEAN Chair 2014.

The ERIA Media workshop was organized by the Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA) and supported by

The workshop titled "Challenges Ahead: Myanmar's ASEAN 2014 and Beyond" touched on the three pillars of ASEAN Community—economic, political and security, socio and culture. Dr. Hank Lim, Chairperson of ERIA Academic Advisory Council, Prof. Fukunari Kimura, Chief Economist of ERIA and Dr. Fauziah Zen ERIA researchers and Mr. Kavi Chongkittavorn ERIA Senior Advisor discussed the implications of Myanmar's chair, Myanmar Comprehensive Development Vision, ASEAN Connectivity and Public Private Partnership.

After the reform in 2011, Myanmar's media community has enjoyed openness and freedom to cover daily news both domestic and international issues. As the next year's ASEAN chair, local journalists are paying attention to issues within ASEAN and Myanmar.

ERIA has also trained officials from various ministries in Nay Pyi Taw in its capacity-building program.

A total of 100 journalists including printed and electronic media, bloggers and interested freelance writers attended the workshop.

Two workshops - one on economic and the other on political and security - are scheduled specifically to assist journalists to write and follow-up issues in these areas moderated by experts as resource persons.
