Myanmar: PPP Is Vital for Infrastructural Development

Nay Pyi Taw, July 24, 2013 – The Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA) held the last event of the series of Capacity Building Seminar on Public Private Partnership (PPP) for CLM countries in Myanmar today with 70 officials from various ministries and private sector attending the event.



With ongoing economic reform, Myanmar needs to team up with private sector to promote infrastructural development in the country. For the past 60 years, Myanmar's development depended solely on state funding. Now with the extensive economic reform and new investment law, Myanmar is attracting new investment from within and aboard in electricity, water, transportation and telecommunication.

"We need financial, technology and innovation to help our country to develop infrastructure," said H.E. Dr. Khin San Yee, Deputy Minister of National Planning and Economic Development, Myanmar.

Dr. Khin San Yee also said that concerned ministries and private sectors need to coordinate their development efforts. Myanmar is taking up the chair of ASEAN next year. Many infrastructural projects in the Master Plan for ASEAN Connectivity have been identified. The ASEAN members are studying way to mobilize funding for the future projects.

Prof Yasuhiro Yamada, Special Assistant to the Executive Director of ERIA said that the PPP system is a good way to promote infrastructural development because the private sector has finance, ideas and innovation to engage infrastructural projects. Many developing countries have successfully been utilizing the PPP for their infrastructural development.
